

# 2015 Ottawa County YAS Report for Twelfth Grade Youth

## Introduction

The grade level reports are an addendum to the 2015 Ottawa County Youth Assessment Survey (YAS) featuring either the responses of 8<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade students alone. Since the YAS has been administered every odd year since 2005, there are now six survey years of data to more closely examine the current status and historical trends in both risky and beneficial behavior among youth in these three grades in Ottawa County.

## Selected Highlights of this YAS Sub-Group Report

While looking through each respective grade level report you may notice some of the following:

- 8th and 10th graders are bullied more often than 12th graders (8th are significantly higher at school, on the way to/from school, and in their neighborhood).
- As the grade level goes up, so does the prevalence of drug use.
- 8th graders have the highest proportion of students exercising to lose weight.
- 8th graders also tend to have the most positive view of school.
- 8th and 12th graders both have negative trends in regards to depression and suicidal behaviors.
- Perceptions of marijuana use are trending negatively for all grade levels.
- Perceptions of other drug use are trending negatively for 12th graders.
- 12th graders tend to have their nutritional behaviors trending negatively (especially for fruit/vegetable intake).
- The fewest YAS measures are moving in the right direction for 12<sup>th</sup> graders. Of the 167 YAS measures that have enough years of data to test for statistically significant linear trends, 46.7% have beneficial trends for 12<sup>th</sup> graders compared to 53.3% and 56.3% for 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students, respectively. Additionally, 15.6% of measures have unbeneficial trends for 12<sup>th</sup> graders compared to 10.8% and 9.6% for 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders.
- Considering all of the sub-group reports together, male students had the most measures trending in a beneficial direction (65.8%) while Hispanic students had the least (38.3%). Conversely, measures trending in an unbeneficial direction were most prevalent among female students (19.2%) and least prevalent among male students (9%).

# Interpreting the Results

## Data Presentation

The data for twelfth grade youth are displayed in five column areas:

- Issue Area – survey questions are organized into issue areas
- Total N – the number of 12<sup>th</sup> graders who responded to each question
- Total Responses – starting with 2015 and going back to 2005; the number in parentheses beneath each year indicates the total number of 12<sup>th</sup> grade respondents for the respective year
- 2015 12<sup>th</sup> Grade responses by Gender
- 2015 12<sup>th</sup> Grade responses by Race/Ethnicity

## Data Cells

The number beneath each year is different in the optional Sexual Behavior section of the report since some school systems elected not to include those questions. An **n/a** in any cell of the Total Responses columns indicates that the 2015 question was not asked in that year or has been changed enough that it is no longer comparable. An **\*\*n/a** indicates that results are suppressed in any sub category columns when there are fewer than 5 respondents.

In each of the report's data cells (Figure 1), the top number is the weighted percent of 12<sup>th</sup> grade students reporting the behavior and the bottom number is the count of 12<sup>th</sup> grade students who answered yes to the corresponding question. The number in parentheses beneath each year in the Total Responses section indicates the total number of 12<sup>th</sup> grade respondents for the respective year.

The results given for the Gender and Race/Ethnicity categories show only 2015 data. Each data cell (Figure 2) contains the results that correspond to those 12<sup>th</sup> graders who reported the question out of the total 12<sup>th</sup> grade respondents within each gender or each race/ethnicity.

- In 2015, 32.3% of 12<sup>th</sup> grade females (205 of all 12<sup>th</sup> grade female respondents) versus 15.3% of 12<sup>th</sup> grade males (109 of all 12<sup>th</sup> grade male respondents) reported feeling sad or hopeless almost every day for two weeks or more in a row.

### Margin of Error








Use caution when comparing the results of 12<sup>th</sup> grade students between any given survey year, gender or race/ethnicity. Because the YAS surveys a representative sample of youth among the whole population of 8<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders in Ottawa County, there is a small margin of error around each result; percentages that have small differences may actually not be statistically different from one another. ### Methods

The methodology of these reports is similar to the county-wide 2015 YAS report (see the **Methods** section of the 2015 YAS report ([www.miOttawa.org/2015YAS](http://www.miOttawa.org/2015YAS)) for additional details regarding the methods of data preparation and analysis, as well as the limitations inherent in the YAS survey process). In the 2015 YAS there is an overrepresentation of 8<sup>th</sup> graders and an underrepresentation of 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders. To account for this, each student’s data are assigned a post-stratification weight to improve how well the results actually represent student responses from participating schools. This is done by comparing the actual number of respondents in 8th, 10th and 12th grades per school to the reported headcount for those grade levels per school.

- While this report only contains responses from 12<sup>th</sup> graders, the same post-stratification weights used in the county-wide YAS report are used in the grade level reports to maintain consistency and to make the data more representative of Ottawa County’s true proportion of students in each grade level.
- All percentages in this report are weighted; all student counts are not weighted.
- Since the questions in the Sexual Behavior section were optional for schools, not all students had these questions. The number of 12<sup>th</sup> grade respondents, and the post-stratification weight used for each respondent, is different for this section.

Once a subset of the data was created containing only the desired grade level, the same analysis was run on the data as the county-wide 2015 YAS. This produced population proportion estimates for each behavior included in the YAS as well as linear trends for each behavior that had at least 3 years’ worth of data. Statistically significant linear trends are indicated by the symbols in the table below.
